Bellevue Public Schools Results

This supplement to the Post School Outcomes Survey Methodology Report provides more detailed results for Bellevue Public Schools as part of the 2020 Post School Outcomes Survey. Results for both Bellevue Public Schools and the overall survey population are provided below. The results provided here are intended to provide more specific information for use by individual school districts and ESUs.

This data collection effort is required by the Federal Office of Special Education Programs in the U.S. Department of Education as part of the IDEA State Performance Plan. The purpose of the study is to collect and report state and district-wide post-school outcomes data on former students with disabilities, including information regarding their educational and career plans and experiences since leaving high school. In order to gain the opinions and experiences of these students, a survey was designed by Nebraska Department of Education Special Populations Office staff and fielded by the Bureau of Sociological Research (BOSR) at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

Completed interviews were collected with 43 students, parents, or guardians in Bellevue Public Schools. Results collected from Bellevue Public Schools students only are provided in the column marked "Bellevue Public Schools." Results gathered from the overall group of students (N=1038) participating in the 2020 Post School Outcomes survey can be found in the column marked "Statewide." This information is intended to serve as an indicator of how individual school districts and ESUs compare to statewide survey results.

It may be helpful to note that only valid percentages are included for the overall Post School Outcomes survey data and results for Bellevue Public Schools in this report. This means the data reported here does not include cases where a "don't know" or "refused" response was given by the respondent or cases where information is missing due to skip patterns, etc. Because of this, the number of students responding to an item, as indicated in "(n=1)," varies from question to question. Questions were asked of all students responding to the survey unless otherwise noted. Tables have been removed for items that received less than ten student responses. Finally, the reported percentages for the individual ESUs and school districts are calculated with data that has not been weighted back to the overall population as characteristics of the groups may not be similar. The reported percentages for the statewide results, however, are calculated using weighted data which makes results more generalizable to the overall population. In 2018, additional requirements needed to be met in order for students to reach each target. For the 2020 Post School Outcomes Survey, Nebraska's goals to meet each target experienced an increase. The combination of increased target goals, as well students needing to meet further requirements to meet the targets may explain variance in reporting numbers compared to previous years.
